DEUX NOUVEAUX PROJETS INDUSTRIELS LOCALISES SUR LE PARC INTERNATIONAL D'ACTIVITES

DAEWOO ELECTRONICS

DAEWOO ELECTRONICS Ltd vient d'annoncer la construction de sa nouvelle unité de production, destinée à la fabrication de tubes de télévision couleurs sur le Pôle Européen de Développement de Longwy (Meurthe-et-Moselle).

DAEWOO est déjà présent en Lorraine depuis 1988 par deux installations : l'une à VILLERS LA MONTAGNE près de Longwy où elle emploie près de 160 personnes dans la fabrication de fours à micro-ondes, l'autre à FAMECK en Moselle où une unité de 314 personnes est en cours de montage pour produire des téléviseurs à partir d'Avril 1993.

La nouvelle usine de tubes couleurs sera implantée sur un terrain initial de 12 hectares situé près du point triple, dans des bâtiments spécifiques à construire d'une surface de 28 780 m². Cette usine exportera 65 % de sa production.

L'outil de production, d'une valeur de 480 MF (pour un investissement total de 825 MF) permettra une production de 800 000 tubes avec 640 personnes dont 21 Coréens.

ANAF FRANCE

La PMI italienne ANAF SPA a confirmé sa volonté de localiser sur le Parc International d'Activités du Pôle Européen de Développement une unité de production d'extincteurs individuels.

L'objectif de production se situe à 300 000 unités, pour une exportation au départ de 30 % du volume, en progression jusqu'à 55 %.

Cet investissement représente un programme de 20 MF environ, permettant la création de 30 emplois qualifiés. L'unité de production couvrira 3 000 m² dans un premier temps (pour être portés à terme à 5 000 m²). Elle sera située sur la commune de MONT SAINT MARTIN.
